OUR IMPACT CONTINUES TO GROW



In May 2023, Foundation SA celebrated our two-year milestone as a statewide community foundation dedicated to growing giving to positively impact South Australian communities.

During the 2022/23 financial year, Foundation SA awarded \$315,000 in grants to support communities across South Australia. This includes both donor-advised grants from our sub-funds and grants from Foundation SA.

This year we ran our first public fundraising campaign, creating the South Australian Disaster Recovery Fund to provide all South Australians with a way to support people in Riverland and Murraylands communities who had been impacted by devastating floods in early 2023.

By combining private foundation funding with general public fundraising we were able to support more community groups when they needed it. Our reach exceeded all expectations — thank you to everyone who generously donated and made it possible for us to award nine grants to non-profit organisations delivering muchneeded recovery initiatives within these local communities. Raising awareness of the need for giving and ways of doing that is a key motivator for our work and we are pleased to have received positive feedback from our fund holders and donors about how easy Foundation SA makes the process of giving, and how being able to include family members and invite employees to participate in philanthropy makes it all the more enjoyable.

I'm also pleased to share that Foundation SA is making significant progress in building a perpetual corpus to ensure long-term sustainability. At the end of the 2022/23 financial year we had 23 sub-funds in the Foundation SA community with a total corpus of more than \$2.3 million invested and growing.

I extend my deepest thanks to every person, business and community that has contributed to the ongoing growth and evolution of Foundation SA — you truly make this a community foundation for South Australia.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN DISASTER RECOVERY GRANTS

Foundation SA established the South Australian Disaster Recovery Fund in early 2023 in direct response to the severe flood crisis in South Australia's Riverland and Murraylands.

All funds raised through the Disaster Recovery Fund support nonprofit organisations working in impacted regions, by providing small grants to aid recovery and build resilience for the future.











TOTAL FLOOD FUNDS DISTRIBUTED \$87,000

Combined with major gifts from the philanthropic sector, Foundation SA raised \$87,000 to support regional floodimpacted communities exactly when they needed it most.

In June 2023, with an independent assessment panel, we awarded nine grants and \$87,700 to community organisations following a competitive grant application process.

DONOR ADVISED GRANTING

This year our donors have granted **more than \$315,000**, with grants ranging in size from \$500 to \$40,000. Our donor advised fund model allows donors to select causes close to their heart or use our granting advisory services to find out where they can have the most impact.

Over the past 12 months, 35 organisations were supported, including: Tjindu Foundation, Catherine House, The Smith Family, Lighthouse Youth Projects, JamFactory, Motor Neurone Disease Association of SA and Safe Pets Safe Families.
